7. ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

To be completed if the Electoral Amendment Bill 2022 is passed requiring parties to file financial statements annually.

From 1 January 2023 registered parties have to file an annual financial statement. The date the annual financial statement is due will depend on the status of the party (incorporated or not). You need to confirm the legal status of the party, the date the annual financial statement is due and whether the statement has to be audited below.
