

WHO MUST FILE A RETURN?

All electorate candidates at the 2017 general election must file a return of candidate donations and election expenses. Even if you have no donations or expenses to declare, you MUST still complete the candidate return recording 'MIL' donations or expe

KEEPING RECORDS OF DONATIONS AND EXPENSES

Candidates must keep good records of all condidate donations and candidate expenses. Candidates must keep invoices and receipts for all election expenses of \$50 or more for three years after returns are filed.

- Itn Intrindual who resides outside New Zealand and is not a New Zealand citizen or registered elector; or
- a body corporate incorporated outside New Zealand; or
- an unincorporated body that has its head office or principal place of business outside New Zealand.

If you receive a conclidate donation from an overseas person exceeding \$1,500 you may retain \$1,500 of that donation. The balance of the donation must, within 20 working days of receipt, either be returned to the overseas person

who made the donotion, or if this is not possible, be poid to the Electoral Commission.

In the condidate return, yev must disclose:

- the date that the donation was received or, in the case of multiple donations, the date each donation was received; and
- The firmunit of the donation or, in the case of aggregated donations, the total amount of the donation; and
- the amount returned to the overseas person or pold to the Electoral Commission, and the date that such payment was made.

Information on Candidate Expenses

Candidate election expenses are the costs of edvertising in any medium that:

- may reasonably be regarded as encouraging or persuading voters to vote, or not to vote, for an electorate candidate (whether or not the name of the condidate is stated), and
- are published, or continue to be published, during the regulated period for the general election (23 June to 22 September 2017), and
- ore promoted by the condidate or with the condidate's outbority.

Election expenses include:

- the casts incurred in the preparation, composition, printing, postage and publication of the advertisement, and
- the reasonable market value of any material used or applied towards the advertisement provided to the pandidate for live or below reasonable market value.

A candidate's deposit or the costs of hall hire, retreshments, the conduct of enveys or opinion polis, the abover, the transwork that supports hoordings (other than a commercial frameway) or replacing materials that have been destroyed through no fault of the condidate are not election expenses.

Your election expenses during the regulated period must not exceed \$20,200 (including \$51). It is an affence to spend more than this,
